## **Immigration Project**

You will be telling a digital story about the life of a person who has immigrated to Canada from another country. Your project will include facts about your family history, a voiceover telling the story of your character and photos to show how their experience might have been. Your finished story must be between 2-3 minutes long. Your story can be documented through iMovie, or you can create a slideshow and do your voiceover using QuickTime.

## **Story Criteria:**

- 1. My story tells about who my character is, what they feel and what this event or situation means to them in a personal way. It is a very real and emotional experience.
- 2. I share information, values and attitudes about history, culture and heritage of a specific immigrant group.
- 3. My digital story flows well. I tell the story using the shortest path. My story is no more than 3 minutes.
- 4. Organization and sequence present a logical progression of ideas/events and is unified and complete.
- 5. Vocabulary, audio and graphics are chosen to communicate in an engaging way.

Interview someone in your family in hopes to answer the following questions to the best of your abilities. **All information needs to be in your own words.** Some of the questions will require you to think about a person's experience. Record the information in a Google Doc. Using the facts from the interview, you will create a fictional story from the point-of-view of your character, documenting your journey to Canada.
